
Enjoy His Gifts! 📕

As "Tiffany" was leaving, to move to her own place, she left this letter in the Admin box at the Women & Children's Home. What a sweet reminder that good things happen at Cornerstone every day!

"As an inmate here in South Dakota, being from Wyoming, I was honestly full of anxiety, fear, uncertainty, lack of self-confidence and trust. I was ready for a change in my life. I eventually ended up in Pierre at the women's prison, trying to regain self esteem and respect – rebuilding broken relationships with my adult kids and my sister that between an abusive relationship and my addiction to meth had been hindered. I was then transferred to Sioux Falls as an inmate at a work release center. I worked 2 jobs – 7 days a week until I was transported because I was now on parole to Cornerstone through the CTP program. Since being here I've continued to work on my relationships. I started working full time 10 days after I got here. I've been clean and sober going on 14 months. I got a car, which I was able to pay for, my own insurance, plates and 3 new tires.

I needed a safe structured environment that was supportive and held me accountable and I've received that here. I recently also got approved for my own place. The staff here helped me by allowing me to share my fears even when irrational. They were there to lend encouragement when I recently returned to Wyoming to enter my daughter into drug rehab. They cheered me on with my own recovery and have been very helpful in guiding and encouraging me to keep finding my strengths. I'm extremely grateful that this home is an option for women like me."

We cheer Tiffany on and pray for her continued success!
