Great news is here and for many reasons: God loves us and cares for us; spring is finally here and the flowers are more beautiful than ever; and we are expanding our Women & Children's Home! Cornerstone Women & Children's Home moved to its current location in August 2015. After a few years of settling in, getting stronger programming in place, and becoming a fixture in the neighborhood, we are expanding into the empty side of our Home. For the past 3.5 years we have housed up to 36 women and children in one half, and the soon to be opened other half will give us 32 more beds for services. The need is definitely there as single mothers with children continue to be the fastest growing segment of the homeless population.

We are excited to be able to help more women and families get needed healing and rest and get back on their feet. Finding employment is a requirement, as is any type of counseling or drug and alcohol treatment they might need. Helping these women and children pick up the pieces of the trauma they have experienced is so rewarding. More importantly, it is a mandate given to us by God. We are grateful to be able to fill both of those roles thanks to supporters like you.

We wanted to give a shout-out to some angels sent to us to make our expansion possible: Dr. Bill Howard who tirelessly went door-to-door to visit his neighbors, requesting they sign a petition to allow us to expand; Ardie Koppelman, who also raised support for us from many of her neighbors in West Hills Village; Janelle Fisk of Fisk Engineering who spearheaded this expansion and filed all the paperwork and managed the process; Vicki Fisher, City of Rapid City Planning and Zoning, who helped us navigate the city requirements and was a huge supporter of ours; the Planning and Zoning Committee who unanimously voted for our expansion; Ron Johnsen who worked tirelessly with everyone above and oversaw the entire project; and of course our neighbors who we have grown close to in the last 3.5 years and support our efforts.

I would be remiss to not thank Jim Castleberry, former CRM Executive Director, who had the foresight to see the need for a better Women & Children's Home and worked with the city and the neighbors to open at our current location. A special shout out and thank-you to Dr. Mark Harlow, Regional Health, who worked diligently with Regional Health (previous owners of the building) to negotiate the best price possible to open a place of hope and healing for homeless women & children!

As you can see, it takes a community; and our donors and sponsors keep that community going. We will let you know when our Open House is – we hope to see you there!
