Let the Son Shine!








I received a letter from an individual that had been housed in the Cornerstone CTP Unit. While he stayed here, he struggled with drug addiction. The young man continued to have positive UA's and had a very hard time dealing with his addictions. The staff at the CTP Unit continued to assist him in every way, giving him chance after chance and making referrals to other agencies to assist the young man. The staff refused to give up on him, and he continued to try. The day finally came when he was well enough to exit the CTP Program and go out on his own.

In his letter to me, he kept saying over and over, "Thank you for not giving up on me." He stated that the staff at Cornerstone are the first people that he has had in his life that have not given up on him. He went on to tell me that he now has his own place to live, a wife, and a new daughter. He said that he is now drug free for the first time in a long time, and he now has a job that he has been able to keep. Before because of his addictions, he was not able to keep a job. He ended his letter by saying that because of the dedication that the Cornerstone Staff had, it has changed his life and that he just wanted to let us know that we do make a difference, and he thanked me once again.


