As we reflect on our Cornerstone summer, it has been busier than usual. As most of you know, we have a statewide grant to house homeless veterans called the Supportive Services for Veterans Families (SSVF Grant.) We have opened an office in Sioux Falls for our staff as the program continues to grow. This complements our SSVF office in Rapid City nicely, and we are firmly anchored on both sides of the state to serve those who have served us.

We have also purchased a motel in Rapid City to serve as a short-term medical respite center for those who are homeless and in need of continued care but are not necessarily sick enough to need a hospital bed. This will open much-needed hospital beds in our community and bring healing before they return to the Mission or another home. This is a partnership between the South Dakota Department of Health, Monument Health, the Rapid City Fire Department Integrated Health Program and Cornerstone Rescue Mission. We are a pilot program for the state and are excited to partner with these agencies to provide services to this unique group.


Cornerstone will be providing the space to heal, while the doctors and mobile medics and their Community Health Care providers assist with medication management and medical care. We expect to open this fall so more details to follow!
