In 1944 the allied forces liberated Bastogne, Belgium. There was a certain 10-year-old girl who lived there at the time: her name was Genevieve, and she was cold. An American GI saw her need and gave her a blanket. To him it may have been a natural reaction to seeing a need. To her it was a life defining moment. Since then Genevieve has personally knitted hats and scarves to give back to veterans in "repayment" of the blanket given to her in her time of need so many years ago.

Recently Cornerstone had the opportunity to personally receive these handmade treasures from Genevieve. She is 80, and full of life and love for others. She excitedly shared her story with me and presented 200 hats and scarves which she had knit over the last year. She feared that it was merely a trifle and that it really would not matter, but when I explained the blessing she was giving us she hugged me and said, "I can't believe we could survive the Nazi's but we still have people who are cold all winter."




A Veteran's story with a happy ending

Cornerstone Rescue Mission's newest program for veterans has had a great deal of success in helping Veterans and their families. The program – Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) was recently contacted by a veteran who had moved here from Sisseton, SD in hope of finding employment and better opportunities. He was staying in a hotel with his wife and four children with the youngest child being only 2 months old. The man had heard about Cornerstone and came to see if we could be of any assistance.



He met with an SSVF case manager and shared that he was out of money, and could not continue to keep a roof over

his families head. They were on the verge of having to leave the hotel and he was hopelessly unsure of what to do next. That's when the SSVF case manager was able to set them up with funding available for just this kind of need thru a Housing (HUD VASH) program and helped them locate an apartment. The SSVF program helped with the security deposit, past utility bill and utility deposits. Immediate needs including beds were found for the entire family. The SSVF program also provided repairs on their vehicle and the case manager found child care so the veteran and his wife could look for employment. This was several months ago and both the husband and wife found employment. This story has a happy ending, they got settled in their new home and had plans for a good Christmas and a happy new year. Without Cornerstone Rescue Mission's programs many families such as this would continue without hope and a future. But God's word in Jeremiah reminds us that He has good plans for all of us, not to harm us but to give us hope and a future.
