

### **Homeless Count - What's in the Numbers?**

On January 29 the Rapid City Community did its annual "point-in-time" count. This is a coordinated function among a variety of law enforcement, health care and social services agencies, as well as volunteer groups and religious organizations. The goal is to gather enough data to offer suggestions on how best to target the various needs of people who struggle to make ends meet.

The survey uncovers information that shows how those specific needs vary from situation to situation. It also reveals that a large spectrum of personal circumstances may bring people to the point of homelessness.

In our facilities we have seen the greatest increase in the need for emergency shelter for women and children. This



The good news is this issue is not going unnoticed and community partners are meeting to develop both short- and long-term strategies to better coordinate services. Cornerstone is a key player in this initiative but also in spreading the light and hope through a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

### **Great ImagiNation**

Rapid City Christian School has two teams taking part in a great opportunity called Destination Imagination. It is a national program striving to be the global leader in teaching the creative process from imagination to innovation. According to the organization, the goal of the program is to develop opportunities that inspire the global community of learners to utilize diverse approaches in applying 21st-century skills and creativity.

The Destination Imagination program encourages teams of learners to have fun, take risks, focus, and frame challenges while incorporating science, technology, engineering, and mathematics, the arts, and service learning. Participants learn patience, flexibility, persistence, ethics, respect for others and their ideas, and the collaborative problem solving process. Teams may showcase their solutions at a tournament.

The girls pictured here are on one of Rapid City Christian's two teams. They chose Cornerstone Rescue Mission as the focus of their Destination Imagination project. Their project focus was service learning; the girls sold raffle tickets and helped with the decorations for our annual fundraiser, spent a Saturday at the Thrift Store cleaning and sorting toys, served lunch at the mission, and made care packages for 100 Cornerstone guests. As the girls worked on every





project they got a real sense of the needs of the homeless and needy in our community. They videotaped their projects and work done for Cornerstone, which will be presented at the Destination Imagination tournament in March. Let's cheer them on!

### **Veteran Finds a Purpose at Cornerstone**

In 2011, Sean came to the Cornerstone Rescue Mission veterans' program feeling as if he had no real plan for where he wanted to be and nowhere to live.

Originally from the Wichita tribe of Native Americans in Oklahoma, Sean decided he wanted to serve his country and enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1974. He served as an operations specialist and

a radar operator and was stationed in Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. Sean lived in Hawaii for 12 years, and after his second divorce decided to go back to Oklahoma. Sean worked at construction and odd jobs and then at the suggestion of his cousin moved to South Dakota and came to the veteran's wing at Cornerstone Rescue Mission.

During his stay at the veteran's wing, Sean has lived a positive lifestyle. He goes to the gym every day, walks, eats healthily, and is a good mentor for several of the other veterans living at the Mission. He worked part time at the veteran's outreach center and did such a good job that he was promoted to a supervisor in the veteran's wing in October 2012.

Sean is friendly and loves to help new veterans get oriented to the facility and to the programs available in the community. Sean is saving up his money to be able to reach his goal to find permanent housing.

Cornerstone Rescue Mission has approximately 50 veterans in our transitional housing program and can house up to 60. We are honored to share a part

in the recovery and re-entry process for our veterans. Many people don't realize that veterans comprise 23 percent of the homeless population. The Department of Veterans Affairs is taking decisive action to end veteran homelessness. All veterans at risk for homelessness or attempting to exit homelessness must have easy access to programs and services. About one-third of the adult homeless population has served in the armed services. Many others

are considered near homeless or at risk because of poverty, inadequate support from family and friends, and dismal living conditions.

Your continued support for our work at Cornerstone can bring hope and healing to Sean and other veterans who have given so much to our country.

## **Supportive Services for Veterans' Families**

Cornerstone Rescue Mission has received a Supportive Services for Veterans Families (SSVF) grant for western South Dakota. The intent of this grant is to provide temporary assistance and services for qualified veterans and their families to help them avoid becoming homeless or to assist them in obtaining suitable housing. Basic qualifications are:

- **Veterans:** May be single or part of a family in which the head of household, or spouse, is a veteran. Discharge status must be under conditions other than dishonorable.
- **Very Low Income:** Veterans and their household members must make less than 50% of the area mean income for the county they live in.
- Currently residing in permanent housing, at risk of losing housing and becoming literally homeless but for SSVF assistance or
- Currently homeless, scheduled to become a resident of permanent housing within 90 days pending the location of housing or
- Has exited permanent housing within the previous 90 days in order to seek housing that better fits their needs.

The SSVF grant can assist with rent, utilities, some deposits, some transportation, childcare and some emergency supplies. For further information, please contact Teena Conrad at Cornerstone Rescue Mission at 341-2844.
