As we transition from the busyness of summer to a different kind of busyness in the fall (school, football, etc.) I look back at how quickly the summer flew by and I think about fall and all the events happening at Cornerstone. We seem to be busy all year round, but I wanted to take the opportunity to catch everyone up.

Cornerstone Apartments is our 24-unit family complex for those who are disabled and are formerly homeless. All the apartments are full, case managers and apartment inspections are being completed, and it is bustling with activity as the kids get ready to go to school.

Cornerstone Women & Children's Home expanded and added another 32 beds and people are getting settled in. It is so nice to have women and children in a nicer place and we have seen so much progress in our clients already.

Cornerstone Rescue Mission is full, and our guests are doing very well with our new programming. They are getting identification documents, finding jobs and working on moving out. Our transitional housing program is strong - we have had five people move out this week alone. Our veterans wing continues to flourish as we take homeless veterans and house them in the community. Our Supportive Services for Veterans Families grant will start a new

cycle on October 1. This is a statewide grant to keep low-income veterans from being evicted and to take them from homelessness to housed. This will be our 7th year administering this grant, and every year we house over 250 veterans. And, between the apartments, the Women and Children's Home and the Mission, we house almost 300 people nightly right here in Rapid City.

Thank you for being a part of housing a veteran, giving a child a safe place to live so they can go to school and learn with a good breakfast and a safe haven. Thank you for helping us provide cooking classes, life skills classes, budgeting classes and other skills so we can help people move out and be good tenants. We are excited to have you be part of the family and wanted you to see all the good that you are doing. What is God doing?...A LOT! He continuously helps us meet the needs of the neediest in our community with your love, compassion and support. Thank you for all you do to bring hope and healing into people's lives. That is exactly what God has called us to do!
