Cornerstone Rescue Mission has approximately 50 veterans in our transitional housing program, and can house up to 60. We have added some female veterans to the guests at the Women and Children's Home. Estimates suggest nearly 200,000 Veterans—male and female—are homeless any given night and perhaps twice as many experience homelessness at some point during the course of a year. While most homeless Veterans are male—nearly 5 percent are women. One such woman recently came to the Cornerstone Women and Children's Home. We'll call her "Faye".

'Love at first sight' -that is the reaction of many who meet Faye. Her contagious yet soft laugh and smile make even a stranger feel welcome. At 80 years old she is very active. Most days she is out the door before six in the morning headed to the local gym only to stop back in later to meet friends eagerly awaiting her return to hear the news of her day. Faye has a way of making small accomplishments inspire, or at the very least, bring a smile to everyone's faces.

Faye is a Korean War Veteran who served her time as a nurse. Her compassion and the pride she shows in her work still shine through even today. She

finds great joy in sharing her talent of cooking with others. She is a very independent person with a few tendencies towards being stubborn... living at the shelter has shown her how to ask for help when she truly needs it. The staff at the Women and Children's Home has helped Faye with a number of needs including assistance with filling out applications, transportation to meetings, advocating on behalf of Faye, and emotional support.

Faye should be getting into her own housing rather quickly due to her persistence and determination. We will miss her warm smile, contagious laugh, amazing meals and most of all her friendship here in the home. We all could learn great things from Faye.

We are honored to share a part in the recovery and re-entry into the community of these veterans. Many people don't realize that veterans of the United States Armed Forces comprise 23 percent of the homeless population. Conservative estimates by the National Coalition for Homeless Veterans count one out of every three homeless men who is sleeping in a park, alley or under an overpass as an individual who has served our country as a member of the armed forces.

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is taking decisive action to end Veteran homelessness. All Veterans at risk for homelessness or attempting to exit homelessness must have easy access to programs and services. About one-third of the adult homeless population has served in the Armed Services. Many others are considered near homeless or at risk because of poverty, inadequate support from family and friends, and dismal living conditions.

Your continuing support of our work at Cornerstone can help us bring hope and healing to Faye and other individuals like her who have given so much to our country. Thank you.
